Current level of funding

- 1.1 billion available annual in Aisa. The demand minimum 3.1 billion.
- If for promoting all level activities, prevention, control, condom promotion, MSM, the demand would be 6 million annually
- Shortfall
- The investment is plateuing in the last 3 years. Even there was a little bit increase.
- Money increase when the eco increase, decrease when the crisis

Where is the money gone?

- Resource are not prioritize
- Go to under wanted intervention
- Actually it go to soft risk group, STI, condom promotion
- Money to the low risk group people other than to higher group people
- Most of the money consume by the agency, UN and other NGOs. Only 4-50% go to service provided
- Call for more efficient and effective on utilization of the resource

Where is our future?

- Increase budget, cos Asia occupies the least GDP for health fund.
- Independence of donors: Data show that 47 % of donation come from internal donors(domestic donors) And account of most the part. Increase but it is not enough.
- The HIV resource is low
- The program is still is not cost effective
- The social equity to be establish where they have crucial for sharing responsibility for these marginalize people
- Health social welfare do not share
- Politic is the solution not the economic number
