After 12 months of internship, I finally decided to work under INGO for the welfare of my countrymen. During this period, my graduation ceremony was hold. I used this period to upgrade my 4 skills of English as it was a must for a staff of INGO.

June 2008-August 2008 : Volunteer Medical Officer, Cyclone Relief Program, Pact in Myanmar, Mawlamyaing-gyun Township, Myanmar

Mawlamyaing-gyun Township is one of the cyclone Nargis hit areas on the night of May 2, 2008. I managed daily trip to cure the victims of cyclone Nargis in this area. I managed for our meals, accommodation and transportation financially. I needed to supervise 2 medical assistants and manage logistically for the needed drugs and medical equipments. I needed to coordinate and collaborate with Township Medical Officer and staffs under other international and local NGOs. I collected survey and data related to the illness of the victims that we treated and compiled these daily and weekly.

August 2008-August 2010 : Township Project Coordinator, Strengthening Community Response to Disease Project, Pact in Myanmar, Nyaung Oo and Pale' Townships, Myanmar

As a Township Project Coordinator, I managed project office and facilities at township level. I supervised, managed and supported to the staffs and community groups where project activities were implemented. I collected and analyzed the project performance and success at village and township level. I liaised and coordinated with government agencies and officials, international and local NGOs and other stakeholders at village and township level. I represented Pact in appropriate gatherings, meetings and forums at village and township level. I ensured timely preparation and delivery of all internal reports such as financial, narrative, project performance and success and

compilation of any other information to Yangon head office. I also assisted Deputy Country Representative in the preparation of detail work plan for the whole program.

September 2010-February 2011: Period of preparation for study of MPH in Thailand

After working for 2 years as a township project coordinator under Pact in Myanmar, I decided to upgrade my education with MPH degree. I used this period to prepare for IELTS exam which was necessary not only to apply MPH course but also for my English proficiency. I sat the IELTS exam in December 2010. What is more, I learned basic Thai speaking, reading and writing to be able to have good communication with Thai society.
